#### 4.1. General First Aid Information

#### 4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

Harmful if swallowed. Causes serious eye irritation. Harmful if inhaled. Flammable liquid. May be fatal if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Forms Cyanide in the body. If ingested, give large quantity of water and induce vomiting. Call a physician immediately. Contact may cause irritation to the skin, eyes and respiratory tract. Wash areas of contact with water. It is excreted in the urine as Cyanide. Acetonitrile metabolizes into Cyanide over 2 to 8 hours, so symptoms or signs of toxicity may be delayed after significant exposure. EYE CONTACT: May cause irritation with burning and stinging with possible damage to the cornea and conjunctiva. SKIN CONTACT: May result in irritating rash. May be absorbed through the skin with effects similar to those of inhalation. CHRONIC EFFECTS / CARCINOGENICITY: Long-term exposures may affect liver, kidneys and central nervous system.

## 4.3. Medical Attention or Special Treatment Needed

Irrigate immediately with large quantity of water for at least 15 minutes. Call a physician if irritation develops. Remove to fresh air. Give artificial respiration if necessary. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Do not give mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. Call a physician immediately. Acetonitrile can cause fatal cyanide poisoning. Available Cyanide antidotes are Hydroxocobalamin, Sodium Nitrite and Sodium Thiosulfate administered via intravenous (IV) infusion by qualified healthcare professionals. Wash areas of contact with soap and water for at least 15 minutes. Call a physician if irritation develops. Dilute immediately with water or milk. Induce vomiting. Call a physician.

# **SECTION 5: Fire-Fighting Measures**

#### 5.1. Extinguishing Media

In case of fire: Use dry chemical, foam or carbon dioxide to extinguish. Use dry chemical, alcohol foam, or carbon dioxide for extinguishing the surrounding fire. Use water as fog in flooding quantities.

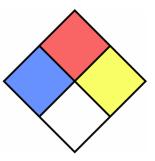
