### SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

#### 4.1. General First Aid Information

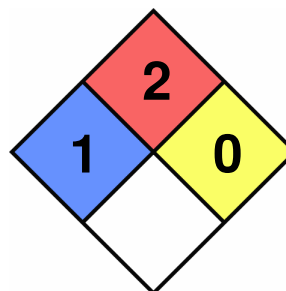
