### SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

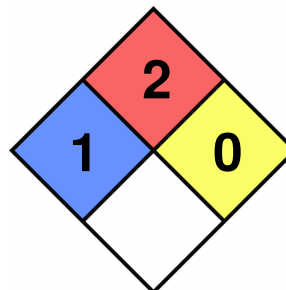
