4.1. General First Aid Information

4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

Harmful if swallowed. Toxic in contact with skin. Causes severe skin burns and eye damage. Causes serious eye damage. DANGER! Corrosive and flammable. Causes burns to all areas of contact. Harmful if swallowed, inhaled, or absorbed through skin. Keep away from heat, sparks, and open flame. Use with good ventilation. Wash areas of contact with plenty of water and get medical attention if necessary. If swallowed, do not induce vomiting. Give large quantity of water and call a physician. EYE CONTACT: Corrosive. Caustic vapors may cause irritation, redness, pain, foggy vision, and corneal edema. Contact may cause eye damage. SKIN CONTACT: Corrosive. Caustic vapors may cause irritation, redness, and pain. Contact may cause skin burns and absorption; symptoms may include hypoactivity, tremors, lacrimation, and salivation. Death may occur from prolonged exposure. 4.3. Medical Attention or Special Treatment Needed


